

FOREWARD

This collection of Knoxville News-Sentinel (TN) articles was begun in February 2020 for the purpose of making historical information available for the 90th Anniversary Celebration of North Knoxville Baptist Church in Knoxville, TN. The Celebration was scheduled for March 29, 2000, but was cancelled because of the COVID-19 Pandemic. The church was founded January 19, 1930.

This is a fairly complete set of articles published from 1930 through 2023 in the Knoxville News-Sentinel about North Knoxville Baptist Church. A few articles were omitted because they had no useful information concerning the history of the church. The search engine failed to find all files pertaining to the church, but no doubt it found the vast majority of them. All images were obtained by copying from the website of the Knox County Library System, and a personal subscription to Newspapers by Ancestry. com. Some of the images, particularly photos, did not reproduce well when they were digitized for the websites.

Some articles were modified by piecing them back together in a more readable format to fit the layout of the articles. Type sizes varied as well as sometimes being spread over several columns or pages, and photos were separated from articles. Also, a few of the referenced page numbers shown are sometimes off by one or two pages.

'Preacher' Carter, Bus Driver, Dies

The Rev. Elbert Otis Carter, a popular transit line driver since he started as a streetcar motor-man 42 years ago, collapsed over his wheel and died yesterday afternoon.

Mr. Carter, who was 61, had just stopped his No. 8-9 Knoxville Transit Lines bus at the end of the Fairmont run at the golf course at Whittle Springs. Another KTL bus operator, William Gann, Tecoma Dr., was with him, riding home.

End Came Suddenly

Operator Carter rose from his wheel to change the bus signs for the return run.

"I'll do it for you," Mr. Gann said, though his fellow driver had not complained of illness. The latter then sat down again and slumped over his wheel. Operator Gann tried to help him and he died in Mr. Gann's arms. Mr. Carter was pronounced dead at St. Mary's Hospital, apparently from a heart attack.

Services will be held at 2 p.m. Sunday at McCarty chapel, with the Revs. W. D. Hutton and Orville Valentine officiating. Burial will be in Roseberry Cemetery. The family will receive friends at McCarty's tonight and tomorrow night.

The veteran driver had been a Baptist preacher for 35 years but had not held a regular pastorate since his heart condition developed about five years ago. His pastorates had included Highland Springs in Grainger County, West Side and **North Knoxville Baptist Churches**.

Always Cheerful

Mr. Carter was a big, cheerful fellow and ever thoughtful of his passengers, particularly those who were disabled.

Mr. Carter was "Preacher" to many of his riders.

He leaves his wife, Mrs. Sarah Ann Griffin Carter; son, Hoyle Benson Carter, a KTL extra driver; and several sisters and brothers. The home is at 3810 Selma Ave.

Mr. Carter was the first secretary-treasurer of Amalgamated Motor Coach Employes Local 1164 here.

Cycle Officer Killed in Wreck

Hits Guard Rail
on Clinton Highway

A Knoxville policeman died last night in an accident in which his motorcycle went out of control on the Clinton Highway approach to the I-75-Dutch Valley Loop Interchange.

Police said John Phillips, 38, of 512 E. Oak Hill Ave., first hit the guard rail on a slight curve about 440 feet northwest of the Dutch Valley overpass.

He was traveling southeast, in the left-hand lane. He apparently was thrown over the handlebars when the motorcycle struck a traffic sign post in the median strip. The cycle skidded on several more feet, to stop under the overpass.

Police believe Officer Phillips' head struck the sign post, causing the fatal injury. An oncoming car grazed the officer's legs, but the driver, Mrs. Carol S. Myers of Powell, was

not negligent, according to Lt. Carl Suddath. No charges were placed against her.

Officer Phillips apparently was returning to the station at the end of his shift. He was taken to St. Mary's Hospital, where attendants pronounced him dead.

Traffic Lt. Jimmy Lippert, Officer Phillips' immediate superior, called him "a fine officer" who discharged his duties well and effectively.

Officer Phillips' was also with the Knox County sheriff's department for a number of years before becoming a policeman six years ago. He was a captain on the sheriff's staff before he went with the city, a deputy said.
