#### **FOREWARD**

This collection of Knoxville News-Sentinel (TN) articles was begun in February 2020 for the purpose of making historical information available for the 90th Anniversary Celebration of North Knoxville Baptist Church in Knoxville, TN. The Celebration was scheduled for March 29, 2000, but was cancelled because of the COVID-19 Pandemic. The church was founded January 19, 1930.

This is a fairly complete set of articles published from 1930 through 2023 in the Knoxviile News-Sentinel about North Knoxville Baptist Church. A few articles were omitted because they had no useful information concerning the history of the church. The search engine failed to find all files pertaining to the church, but no doubt it found the vast majority of them. All images were obtained by copying from the website of the Knox County Library System, and a personal subscription to Newspapers by Ancestry. com. Some of the images, particularly photos, did not reproduce well when they were digitized for the websites.

Some articles were modified by piecing them back together in a more readable format to fit the layout of the articles. Type sizes varied as well as sometimes being spread over several columns or pages, and photos were separated from articles. Also, a few of the referenced page numbers shown are sometimes off by one or two pages.



# Suspicious Fire Damages North Knoxville Church

Members of North Knoxville Baptist. Church today began cleaning up their church which was heavily damaged by a "suspicious" fire at 5:31 a.m. yesterday.

The fire, which was confined to the sanctuary caused some damage to the "entire complex" of the 1000-member church, 221 W. Oldham Ave., fireman said. Firemen found all doors locked except one, and a piece of glass was missing from it, which led them to believe someone opened the door by breaking the glass.

The church has been broken into several times before.

The fellowship hall will be used for services Sunday, according to Mrs. Guy Milam, wife of the pastor, and special music programs tonight and tomorrow night will be held as scheduled.

The fellowship hall is separated from the main building by a 20-foot archway, according to Deputy Fire Marshal Lynn Beeler, who is a member of the church. He said the fellowship hall and other parts of the church received smoke or water damage.

Mrs. Milam said the church usually has about 270 to 300 persons at Sunday School. A wedding was held in the church the night before.

Firemen said they have not ascertained what started the fire. No damage estimate was made.

The church is only two blocks from Brookside Mills, which was heavily damaged by fire Tuesday. Inspectors are still trying to ascertain the cause of that blaze and suspect arson.

# Fire Investigators Continue To Probe Baptist Church for Evidence of Arson

Fire Department officials still are investigating the possibility of arson in connection with the fire that heavily damaged North Knoxville Baptist Church early Thanksgiving morning.

Chief Paul Warwick said investigators still term the blaze "suspicious," but have not found any solid evidence of arson.

"They sifted through the ruins (Friday), and gathered some material to be analyzed in a laboratory," Chief Warwick said. One reason that arson is being so strongly investigated, Chief Warwick said, "is that we have so far found no other cause for the fire, such as electrical wiring. But we still haven't ruled out any of those, either."

Rev. Guy Milam, pastor, said damage has been estimated at \$750,000. No part of the church, except the sanctuary, can be used, he said. The 1000-member church is at 221 W. Oldham Ave.






